1st Annual Blind Autocross By Tim Steck

Have you ever shut your eyes while driving? Oh, but have you ever raced in an Autocross when you could not see? I have seen some of the Cone Award recipient drive like they can't see!

Do you know someone that just loves to be a "back seat driver"? Bring them along and they can really be a "back seat driver".

Here is how it will work ...

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It will be run just like a normal autocross, AM half and a PM half based on the normal class of the car. There will even be trophies for different classes. There will be four classes as follows: (1st letter is the driver, 2nd letter is the navigator – "M" = a man, "W" = a woman): MM, MW, WW, WM. An example, using Peggy and myself, when I driver I would be in the MW class and when Peggy's drives she would be in the WM class. They will be a trophy for TTOD (Top Time of Day).

The driver will have a cover over their helmet so they can't see. The cover is required to be over the driver's helmet from the start line until they stop after the finish line – they will remove the cover before they pull back into the grid area. The Navigator will sit in the passenger seat and direct the driver on what to do: Faster, slower, turn left, turn right, stop, etc. If a driver removes the cover before they stop after the finish line, their run will be DSQ'd.

All the normal rules of autocross apply, 2 seconds for each cone hit, 10 seconds for each gate missed, stop on red flags, etc.

We will try to get in at least four runs based on # of drivers and time constraints.

Drivers must be an EESCC member, if not a member then sign up as a member on the EESCC website before signing up for the Blind Autocross. Navigators do not have to be an EESCC member, they are not required to drive and they don't even have to autocross before, any licensed driver can be a navigator.

Driver and their Navigator do not have to be codrivers or even drive the same car.

Navigators may have to work even if they don't drive if workers are needed.

If we have enough of drivers then you will only be obligated to a half of the day, BUT if we don't have enough drivers then you will be required to be there all day. We need about 35 unique participants per half counting drivers and navigators to fill our worker's positions.

REMEMBER, to bring your bar codes (the green one will be used), if not the normal \$5 will be charged to replace it.

This event is a **MEMBER ONLY** and **PRE-REGISTRATION ONLY** event, you can NOT sign up for the event on the day of the event.
