arrangements for special pricing for EESCC racers. It will make your car easier to time, and you can run anywhere with those numbers.

SCCA numbers need to be at least 8" high with a 1.25" line width and the class letters need to be at least 4" high with a .75" line width. Class letters need to be between 25% and 75% of the height of the numbers.

After your novice event you really, really need to have your own helmet and numbers!

#### Work Assignments

This is Brady now. I've been racing motorcycles for about three years now, and motorcycles have been my passion for almost twenty years. When my Dad first started talking about this autocross racing, which I had never even heard of, I thought it would be a fun thing to do with my Dad, but I didn't think it would even come close to the enjoyment I get from racing motorcycles. Boy was I wrong! After only four weekends of autocrossing—I am totally hooked on 4 wheels. I am even starting to look at road racing cars too. Anybody got some money I can borrow :-)

There seem to be a lot more similarities between racing cars and bikes than I would have thought. It turns out looking through the corners and getting on the gas early out of the exit makes you go faster on 2 wheels and 4. I am still working on corner entry and better braking though. One of the main differences, which I really like, is that screwing up on 4 wheels tends to result in a harmless spinout, whereas screwing up on 2 wheels results in an ambulance spinning out to come pick you up off the track-not to mention the \$1000 in damage to your bike. Regardless of the dangers, I am addicted to speed and there is no substitute for doing 170 mph on a motorcycle. On the other hand, there is also no substitute for racing with your Dad, in his car, railing through the corners in a turbocharged GTI, killing a few cones, and having a great time.

I'd like to say thanks to everyone in EESCC for being so helpful and welcoming. Racing is a lot of fun, but fellow racers are the ones that really make it enjoyable. I've had a lot to learn about the club, autocross racing, and driving on 4 wheels, and I've never had a problem finding someone who was willing to help me out. Thank you.
