

Donations, combined with some of the entry income allows us to give a well-deserved \$1000. to the Oakridge Fire Department. They donate their time and equipment to assist us with a fully staffed ambulance and fire trucks. We also purchased lunches from the Oakridge Moose Club. Making lunches for us is one of their largest fundraisers of the year. The money is earmarked for their local Oakridge charities.

Throughout the year the club donates money to Food for Lane County. After each event we send a check equaling \$1 for each entry. We not only had a shortened year, but also the rain, cold, and snow at some events lowered our participation level. So an additional year-end donation was sent to FFLC to equal a total of \$1000 for the year. They have food pantries, run Meals-on-Wheels, and Food Rescue programs among other good things they do.

Throughout the year many of you donated money to the 501 C-3, Emerald Empire Sports Park Development Foundation when you paid for your auto-x entry. We have made it easy to make that additional donation when you sign up and then the money is transferred to the foundation. Also, this year EESCC donated three complete seasons entries with membership that were raffled off, one per weekend. Those totaled \$225 each weekend for a total of \$675 donated.

At the holidays we are grateful for all we have, and we wanted to share some of our blessings, so this year we again sent a check for \$300 to The Candlelighters. This is an organization that supports children with cancer and their families through local activities. Support groups, parties, get-togethers and summer camps are just a part of the good they do. Our donation was specifically earmarked for the Mid-Willamette Valley region.

We gave \$300 to Hope & Safety Alliance, which is a Eugene organization dedicated to helping victims of abuse.

In telling you all of this I want not only to let you see some things you may not be aware that our club does, but to encourage you to consider a donation to the many organizations in our area in need, not only this holiday but throughout the year.
